The college is located in the western part of Sri Sri Hayagriba Madhab Dewalaya, and Poa Mecca, Hajo. It is about 30 K.M. from Gauhati University. The College is located at Majorkuri village in Ramdia Mouza under Hajo revenue circle of Kamrup district, Assam.

A brief history of B.C.Medhi College, Ramdia



Binandi Chandra Medhi College, Ramdia (formerly known as Ramdia College) situated at Ramdia, an institution for higher education was established on August 13, 1992. A group of dedicated persons covering the greater area of Ramdia, Bangalpara, Tokradia, Khetrihardia, Barhardia, Sobancha, Dampur etc. with their relentless and untiring effort has established Ramdia College to provide quality higher education. Later on, the college was renamed as Binandi Chandra Medhi College, Ramdia as a gesture of gratitude.

Formerly, the college started in Ramdia Puthibharal Aru Samuhik Sanskritik Kendra from 13th August 1992 and then shifted permanently to its present location on 30th September 1994. The College attained opening permission on 14th August 1993 and was temporarily affiliated to Gauhati University in 1994-95. The college also obtained permission for B.A. Part-I concurrence on 29th December 1999, later on it obtained the Govt. concurrence up to B.A. Part-II level on 27th September 2004. The college got permanent affiliation from GU on 18th December 2009 and was registered under society Act XXI of 1860 on 12th March 2012. It was provincialised in 2013 according to the Assam Govt's Venture Institution Provincialisation Act 2011. The College is included under 2 (f) and 12 (B) of UGC Act. 1956 on 27th February, 2014.

The College got financial support from No. 1 Ramdia Samabai Samiti, public donation, theatrical performance, lottery etc. It is also being funded by the UGC and Government of Assam for its infrastructure and other development.

Rules and Regulations

- ▶ Classes are held from 9.30 A.M. to 4.30 P.M.
- ▶ Students admitted to the college must abide by the rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority.
- ▶ Students must attend their classes at least 75% of the total classes held; otherwise they will be treated as non-collegiate (NC) by the college authority.
- ▶ Students must attend classes and other activities of the college with uniform fixed by the college authority.
- ▶ Students must appear in all the examinations conducted by the college authority.
- ▶ Students must keep their college identity card in the college campus.
- ▶ Students must comply with the educational decorum inside the college campus.
- ▶ Mobile phone is strictly prohibited within the college campus for the students.
- ▶ Smoking and chewing of any kind of tobacco products within college campus is strictly prohibited.
- ▶ The use of single use plastic items is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- ▶ Maintaining neat and cleanliness of the college campus is mandatory for each and every students
- ▶ The college authority reserves the right to change any rules and regulations when required. The decision of the college authority will be final and binding to all concerned.

Some Important Instructions

- Look the notice board daily as soon as you come and before you leave the college.
- Do not move in the corridors and verandahs when classes are going on. Any student found loitering around the verandahs without any valid reason will have to face strict disciplinary action.
- Keep your college clean by using dustbin.
- Do not spit on the walls and in the class rooms; don't write or stick anything on the walls, desks and benches. Anyone caught red handed will be punished.

Student Supportive Services

Personality cum Skill Development Programmes (PSDP)

The college gives maximum emphasis on the development of students' skill, moral character, discipline, punctuality, accountability, sense of dedication to the society, awareness against illiteracy, superstitions and other social evils.



Students' Union

The college students' Union Body i.e. Binandi Chandra Medhi College, Ramdia Students' Union (BCMCRSU) is formed purely in democratic process as per Lyngdoh Committee, UGC. A student who does not have 75% of attendance in the class will not be eligible to be a member of the Students' Union Body.

Cultural and Festive Activities

The college celebrates its Foundation day, Freshmen social, Saraswati Puja, College week, Teachers' day, Death Anniversaries of great persons etc. every year as per academic calendar.



Yoga Programme

The college has introduced Yoga Programmes for students for physical and mental development by the expert instructor.



Wall Magazine

The college has a wall magazine Fehujali which is the mirror of literary creations of the college community. Besides, there are some other departmental wall magazine like Shristi (Assamese Deptt), Artha Probah (Economics Deptt), Vidya-Kosh, Education Deptt), Prakshya Jyoti (Political Deptt.)

College Magazine

The college publishes a Magazine annually titled Binandian which reflects the thinking and feeling of college community through creative writings. At the same time some departments of the college are also publishing departmental magazines like, Pragati (Assamese Deptt.); Pratyasha, (Education Deptt).

National Social Service (N.S.S.)

The college N.S.S. cell has been performing various programmes under experienced and trained Programme Officers.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The college provides NCC. facility through Indian Army Wings. Regular drill practice and theory classes are being conducted by the PI staff appointed by DG, NCC of Indian Army Wings. For proper guide of the students a CTO is also provided from the college side.

The Bharat Scouts and Guides, Assam

The college recently introduced the Bharat Scout and Guides unit in the college to train up the students under experienced Ranger, the Bharat Scouts and Guides, Assam.

College Central Library

The college recently digitized the library as Digital library. It has also a well compact Library with a collection of large number of books, journals, newspapers, magazines for the benefit of the students and teachers as well as employees. It also provides the quiet and safe reading room in the library for the students.



Departmental Library

The college has facilitated departmental library to each department. Apart from the central library, the student can use the books from the departmental libraries.

Sports Facilities

The college has indoor and outdoor sports facilities and equipments for different sports like football, volleyball, badminton, carom, cricket etc.

Indoor Sports & Gym Facility

The college has Indoor Sports & Gym facilities for the students and teachers which is funded by the UGC under 12th Plan period.

Common Room for Students

The college provides separate boys and girls common room for the students with adequate facilities.

College Canteen

The college has canteen facility which remains open during the working hours. It provides hygienic food at nominal rate. It is maintained by a canteen management committee of the college.

Departmental Common Room for Teachers

The college provides Departmental Common Room for Teachers in each department with adequate facilities.

Drinking Water

The college provides purified drinking water for all in the college campus.

Scholarship

Scholarship is provided to the poor but meritorious students as per Govt. norms.

Free Education

Poor meritorious students are given free admission on the basis of the Government policies.

Special Coaching

Special coaching is also provided to the needy students.

Wi-Fi Facility

The college provide Wi-Fi facility within the college campus.



Other Programmes

The college organizes Seminars, Debate, Quiz, Extempore speech, Essay writing competition etc. every year. Besides, the college also organizes several sensitization programmes on health and hygiene, poverty alleviation programme and preservation of the environment etc.

Students' Attendance

The college takes students' attendance strictly in to account for the purpose of allowing students for academic awards and scholarships. Each student is required to attend a minimum of 75% of the total classes held in each subject respectively in an academic session. If a student fails to attend classes for one month at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes his/her seat is liable to be forfeited. The parents and guardians will be issued monthly appraisal/ up-to-dated report of the students, works, and attendance. If at the end of three month duration their attendance is still insufficient (less than 75%), their admission will stand automatically cancelled.
